

## Scavenger Hunt Graphic Organizer Questions

1. What is the title of the book, chapter, or article?
2. What do you already know about this topic?
3. What do you learn about the book from the cover?
4. What do you predict you will learn?
5. Examine the table of contents:
  - ◆ How many units of study are presented?
  - ◆ How many chapters are in the book?
6. Circle the headings with one color, and rephrase each one into a question. Make a prediction about what information may be under the heading.
7. Circle the introduction with a second color, read the first sentence, and make connections, stating them aloud or writing what you already know about this in the margin.
8. Circle the illustrations and/or other graphics with a third color, and read the captions and titles of the graphics aloud. Predict why this graphic is included.
9. Circle the end-of-chapter questions with a fourth color, and underline key words and concepts that might tell us what is important to learn.
10. Circle or highlight key vocabulary words in bold print with a fifth color, and tell what you already know about each word.
11. Circle the summary with another color, and read to identify important information.
12. Read the introduction and identify the sentences that you think are most important.
13. What kind of information is in the appendix?
14. Where are the glossary and index? What type of information is presented in each? Give an example of how each works.
